Emma Wigga MBE

Emma grew up in Watford and throughout her schooling was very active, excelling at hockey. When she was 18, she went on a GAP year to Australia and contracted a virus that left her with irreparable damaged nerves in her legs. Despite this life changing event Emma was determined to pursue her chosen career as a PE teacher, studying Sports Science and gaining a PGCE in secondary PE, she started work in West Sussex in 2004.

Emma won the first ever gold medal in the Women's Va'a Single 200m (VL2) at Tokyo 2020 - a newly added discipline to the Games - powering home in a personal best 57.028 as the only athlete to go sub-one minute. She also won silver in the KL2 event behind teammate Charlotte Henchaw.

She has won a total of eight World Championships and an incredible five European Championships medals throughout her successful career in Para canoe.

 I persevered because I know once I finished I would be really proud of my self.
