Messy Messiah Project


During November, the whole school have worked with St Edmundsbury Cathedral to be part of the Messy Messiah project. The brief was to create a banner to hang in the Cathedral. We were given the words 'Rejoice Greatly' and asked to include symbols of Kingship and peace within our banner, which measures 1 metre by 3 metres.Each school taking part has been given a different theme and quote, making all of the outcomes unique.

Arts Council met to share and collaborate ideas.
They started by discussing our assigned wording
'Rejoice Greatly' and planning the design. Art club
used mixed media materials to collage and make the large dove. They also folded music paper to create the wings and feathers with techniques that gave dimension and effect.

In the classrooms, each child cut a music note, which has been added to the banner.

The final design shows hues of gold, a dove in flight and a crown made from natural materials.

Handel's Messiah was introduced to us through this art-based topic with

St Edmundsbury Cathedral, but it has also inspired and fed ideas into our stained glass style entry for the village Advent Window trail and is also the theme for the decorations that will be displayed on the large Christmas tree donated by the village outside of school, as well as through our designs for decorations that will be part of our entry into the Cavendish Christmas Tree Festival.

The completed banner has been on display inside school to give all children, staff and visitors the opportunity to see the finished artwork before it is taken to St Edmundsbury Cathedral.
